Because she was my bestie's absolute hero. He spent a lot of his little funds during seminary to see her in plays or appearances. And, John finally got an opportunity to meet her in person! It was an intentional meet and greet. In other words, she was being paid to be there. She wasn't out with friends or just going about daily life.

But, she snubbed him and the rest of her (former) fans. John told this story and shared his extreme disappointment and we decided we'd turn against her. So, now when I see her or hear her (admittedly fabulous) voice, I crinkle my nose and think about her hurting my friend.

Who knows, I wonder if John even still holds that grudge? It was almost 15 years ago. But, for me it isn't about Idena. It's about how during that time of John's life he needed good things. He had one bad thing happen after another and I wanted my friend to get a win, even something silly.

It reminds me of things our congregation shares with me, and me with you. So many of you have mentioned that you don't think you should be allowed to feel this way, that way, or another way because "it isn't a big deal." I've heard several of you try and squelch your own feelings even though you could make long lists of the multiple things going wrong. So many of us need the Idena Menzel moment and instead get snubbed.

I think it's time for me to forgive Idena. But, I also think it's time we all forgive ourselves for the times we've taken out 20 bad things on 1 person/thing. Better yet, it's good for us to all see that 20 bad things makes even something silly, terrible and figure out ways to reroute our grief.

Do some meditative praying. And, give yourself peace knowing we're not perfect but that we can work towards wholeness by first admitting where we are not whole.

### The Eyes of Hope

Shakespeare once wrote, "The eyes are the window of the Soul."

As I walked around the room, greeting the boys, I shook their hands and told them to look me in the eyes. It was believed that the eyes revealed a person's inner thoughts and emotions that were hidden in the heart.

After teaching high school English for 33 years, then substitute teaching for another 14 years, I thought my student days were over. Yet, here I am in an elementary school library with 25 fifth grade boys. For the past 10 years I have joined a group of Mentors whose mission is to develop leadership qualities of character, honesty, responsibility, and service. Over a period of 10 meetings, each boy must speak at each meeting, before the entire group. In addition each boy receives a blue collared shirt with a Harns Marsh Mentor Group logo. There are also several field trips planned: tour of Lexington Country Club, home of the Mentor group, a trip to the Minnesota Twins baseball stadium, a work out day at a D-1 fitness facility, a day of golf, (driving range and putting green), and lunch at the Lexington Club pool, and a final celebration at Lexington. It is quite an ambitious program.

The school, Harns Marsh, is located in a high crime high drug community. These boys are mostly from dysfunctional family relationships, where the father may be imprisoned and the mother may have two part time jobs. The Mentors offer these boys positive role models, display socially appropriate behaviors, and most of all encourage the building of a strong confident self image.

We have encouraged the habit of greeting between Mentors and students at the beginning and end of each meeting by shaking hands and looking into each other's eyes. As I met the boys for the first time, I saw anxiousness and apprehension in their eyes. After 2 hours of our first meeting, I observed a different attitude in the room, a spirit of excitement. At the end of the meeting we once again shook hands and I saw a different look in their eyes. I saw anticipation. I saw hope in their eyes.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke, "The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are good your whole body will be full of light. If your eyes are bad your whole body will be full of darkness." (Matthew, 6:22-24)

Let there be light...in the eye of the beholder. Let us look for the light in the eyes of others. Let us be the light of hope for others.

### Do you feed birds in the winter?

According to *Birds & Blooms* magazine: "When feeding birds in winter, some foods are better than others. It's very important for the birds to be able to quickly refuel in the morning after a cold night. Stuff your feeders full of high-calorie, fatty foods, such as peanuts, mealworms, sunflower seeds and suet (all of which stay fresh longer with lower temps).

These foods are high in the fats the birds need and are very easy for a bird to quickly eat with little effort."


