What makes you a little nervous? Could it be God calling you to grow and tie knots? What ways can you push yourself to discover more of who you are and who others are to you? Get out there! Discover! Even if you fail over and over, something tells me that with practice, you've got an infinite chance to get it right.

BLESSED ARE THE HOPEFUL

In 1st Corinthians, Paul writes these iconic words, "These three remain, Faith, Hope, and Love. But the greatest is Love. (13:13). John says boldly, "God is Love". (1 John 4:8). And that "God so Loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son." (John 3:16). Jesus came to earth to preach the Gospel of Love. Yes, Love is the greatest virtue.

Whether a Prisoner of War who was tortured or a survivor of the Holocaust, the victims shared the same spirit to live...Hope. Those martyred for their love of God and faith in Jesus as Savior were sustained by their hope in eternal life.

There is power in Hope. "Blessed is the man that trust in the Lord, and whose Hope the Lord is." (Jer 17:17). "For Thou art my Hope, O Lord, God" (Psalm 71:5).

This poem of Hope is comforting to all who are suffering:

"Behind the cloud the starlight lurks, Through showers the sunbeams fall: For God, who loveth all his works, Has left His Hope for all." (John Greenleaf Whittier)

To live a contented life, follow the three virtues: "LOVE enough to make you useful and helpful to others. FAITH enough to make real the things of GOD. HOPE enough to remove all anxious fears concerning the future." (Johann Wolfgang von Goethe)

- Holly reported that plans are moving forward for the Feeding Fredonia Challenge. The dates are October 15-27. The Food Pantry Taskforce has many exciting ideas.
- Our local Presbyterian Women's chapter has been disbanded. Discussed need to close the bank account.
- The Deacons and Holly are looking at serving communion to our home bound.
- The budget was approved as presented.
- Our fire alarm system needs to be replaced. Bids from Johnson controls and DFT are being considered.
- · John Irish has joined the Christian Education committee.
- New church school curricula are being considered.
- Sunday, September 10 Ryan Williams and David Coia will be baptized during the service which will be held on the shores of Lake Erie.
- Four people have expressed an interest in joining the church.
- Communion was served on July 2 and August 6.
- Another \$40 has come in from the yard sale raising the total to \$1,567.26.
- Mission has made donations to Fredonia Fire Department, Rural Ministry, the Boys and Girls Club, Partners in Kind, Juneteenth, and Kids at Promise.
- There may be an opportunity for our members to help box gifts for the Santa for Seniors program.
- We are collecting school supplies for School 3 in Dunkirk and Wheelock in Fredonia.
- The broken window in the sanctuary should soon be fixed.
- Two more highway clean ups are scheduled.
- The by-laws were reviewed and changes were made.
- Approval was given for Lucy Andrus to conduct free art classes (Art Discovery) in Fellowship Hall on Monday nights on a trial basis. The resulting art work will be displayed in Fellowship Hall.

The next meeting is Thursday, September 21, 2023.
