No fingertip, bath, dish towels, or micro-fiber. • Washcloth. No micro-fiber. • Wide-tooth comb (at least 6 in. of teeth) removed from the package. No picks or pocket combs. • Fingernail or toenail clipper removed from the package (either is acceptable). • Bath-size bar of soap in the original package. • Toothbrushes should be in the in the original package. • Standard size Band-Aids.
