This summer Fredonia High School class of `75 celebrated their 50th class reunion at Shorewood Country Club on a beautiful evening. It was a sentimental journey to reconnect with former students. However, the highlight for me was that they had brought a copy of my FHS Senior Yearbook of `63. There I was on the football, basketball, and tennis teams, in black and white photos, at age 17, 63 years ago. What struck me the most was our class motto: "Ah, but a man's reach should exceed his grasp, Or what is a heaven for?" (Robert Browning)

The motto had no real meaning to me then, but its significance grows as I age. I think of the Wright brothers who reached for the sky and of Neil Armstrong who reached for the moon. 

For students, bus drivers & aides, teachers and staff upon return to school. And for parents adjusting to new schedules!


August Session Quick Notes: Session met 8/21, all in attendance
