### From Our Pastor

Have you heard of a Friction Audit? It's actually a business practice, but I kind of like it for 1. personal uses 2. church uses. Maybe you'll find it useful too!

In our Session Retreat I talked to the Session about this practice. It is where you do an audit of all the friction you're running up against. Say you're a baker and the fancy flour you love is getting harder to get and more expensive. That is friction. So, you come up with 3 ways to stop that friction.

- 1. Use other flour
- 2. 2. Raise menu prices
- 3. 3. Mill your own flour!

I've been loving this practice because it's been helping me not just fret about something. Once you put it on paper, even if you don't come up with the 100% perfect solution, there is less friction. It also asks you to get creative. The first and second solutions are usually the easy ones. It's that third one that asks you to think.

I don't like to think of Church as a personal improvement or self-help kind of thing, but when I have the chance to write about something without the pulpit in front of me, I think it's so helpful for Christians to have less friction so they can focus on worship, on discipleship, and loving kindness. When you've got friction all of those are difficult things. So, maybe this isn't a Christian practice, but I encourage you to give it a try so that Christian practices can move into your daily life without that other static in the way.

### **Unmasked**

Kevin is a typical 5<sup>th</sup> grade boy, a bit taller than his classmates. He is quiet, shy, and seldom talks. He is new to this school, leaving his previous school because he was bullied. Kevin is a member of our mentoring class of 15 Mentors and 24 boys. We Mentors strive to be male role models to develop social manners and communication skills, especially public speaking. All of the boys are encouraged to speak before the group in every class. Now that Covid has passed its peak, we no longer wear white masks which hide our faces and smiles. However, Kevin continues to wear a black mask that covers his nose and mouth. When he speaks in front of the class, he does not show his face or his smile.

While eating, Kevin would pull down his mask below his lower lip, put food in his mouth, then raise his mask once more. The cause of his behavior is to hide the crooked condition of his teeth. To correct his teeth would take 24-30 months and over \$10,000 (no insurance). One of the Mentors has decided to help Kevin by supporting him with encouragement and fund raising so he may live a normal life... unmasked.

"Don't be fooled by the face I wear, for I wear a thousand masks, And none of them are me. Don't be fooled, for goodness sake, don't be fooled. I give you the impression that I am secure, that confidence is my name and coolness is my game, And I need no one, but don't believe me. Beneath dwells the real me in confusion and aloneness, and fear. That's why I create a mask to hide behind. Each time you're kind and gentle, and encouraging, Each time you try to understand because you really care, my heart begins to grow wings. Who am I you wonder. I am every man you meet and also every woman

that you meet. And I am you, also." ("The Mask", Author unknown)

We all wear our self-created mask hiding our real selves. Let us help each other to remove our masks from each other and from ourselves and, like Kevin, live unmasked.
