From Our Pastor



One of the fun things about my call to this church is the variety of backgrounds people are coming from. In my former churches, a majority of the people were Presbyterians, Presbyterians with a few Methodists who married a Presbyterian. But, here, I've really enjoyed learning to pastor people who come from Catholicism, Pentecostal, Mega-ish, nothing, other mainlines, and yes, cradle Presbyterians.

As I was planning the Lenten Theology on Tap (each Tuesday from 5ish to 6:30pm at Downtown Brew), I was thinking about the mix of people who might show up. And, I recalled something I hadn't thought of in years. Scholar and theologian, Walter Wink wrote an article about leading Christian education, aka Bible studies. He said (I'm paraphrasing), when looking at sacred text, everyone is equal. The biblical scholar and a person who has never read scripture before all

have an equal say, an equal "get" at the text. We might all bring different wisdom but none of it is more important than the other.

He is so right! Sitting around the table, we all had very different backgrounds and our conversation was richer for the varying ways we all came to the text: some never having heard the story, some very well versed. Did we fix all the worlds' problems, no. But we did fix a couple and from our equal turns at scripture and learning from the story, we talked about who the Church is and who we can be. And, you'll be seeing fruits of this first meeting soon. That's the way to Lent!

May our work, our shared wisdom, and our equal footing bring us further and further into the hope of God!

"Bless us, O Lord, and these Thy gifts, which we are about to receive, from Thy bounty. Through
Christ, our Lord. Amen"

This standard blessing before meals serves as a reminder to give thanks for our "Daily Bread."

While in Florida, Carol and I volunteer at the Gladiolus Food Pantry. Every Wednesday (10-1) we join ---others to serve over 200 families (nearly 1,000 monthly). Clients fill grocery carts with fresh produce, frozen meats, canned and boxed foods, breads, and desserts. As they walk out the door, they have their choice of a plant or bouquet of flowers. In addition, there is a food tent offering free hot dogs, and a cool drink. Human service groups provide social service information, and a mobile medical unit provides health care. It is quite an operation.

Recently, Carol and I along with 70 volunteers bagged 5,000 pounds of rice and beans. We attended a Hymn Sing where the price of admission was a bag of canned goods. Last week, we participated with an international group, "Feed My Starving Children." In two hours, we bagged over16,000 meals for children around the world. Our church here had a "Souper" Bowl Sunday, where attendees wore their favorite team jerseys (Go Bills) and donated cans of soup. All these efforts, and many others, have one goal - to feed the hungry.

Our fledgling Fredonia Food Pantry, although having fewer resources of food, money, and volunteers, shares the same mission of feeding the hungry and providing for the disenfranchised. As the number of the needy grows, so must our efforts to provide for them. As the hands and feet of Christ, it is our command to feed His children. "Fred Basket" is our way of sharing not only our bread with others, but also God's love.

When Jesus fed the 5,000, He fed them all, no questions asked. As a friend reminds me, "I would

rather be a giver, than a receiver." And so, I give thanks for my Daily Bread and the gift of sharing it with others... Until all are fed.
