"If you look at the field beside the road and you see merely the generic 'meadow,' you're less likely to care if it's bulldozed for a strip mall than you are if you know that those tall, flat-leaved spires are milkweed, upon which the monarchs have flown two thousand miles to feed, or if you can name sailer's breaches and purslane, lamb's-quarter, or the big umbels of wild carrot feeding the small multitudes. Isn't the world larger and more valuable, if you know what an umbel is?"—Mark Doty

NOUN

1. a flower cluster in which stalks of nearly equal length spring from a common center and form a flat or curved surface, characteristic of the parsley family.

I did not know what it was; did you? I love this quotation from Mark because it evokes our core values as a church--not just because of our earth care commitment, but in our values of wisdom, knowing, and knowledge.

Be it the definition of umbel or the true perspective of someone who lives on the margins, when we know something, we are more likely to tune in and understand or acknowledge how that thing works in the world. And, once we know a thing, we start relating to it.

What and who do we not yet know? It's a hard question for obvious reasons—how do you know what you don't know—but I suspect just asking it puts us in a space of seeing what we once looked beyond and then becoming curious about it.

A cluster. Springing from a common center. Separately a tiny, seemingly insignificant flower. Together an umbel, eager to lend nutrients and beauty to the ecosystem.

- The deCycles will be staying in Fellowship Hall June 23. KC Clark-Porter will open the doors
 and make sure they are settled. Jeff McMinn will check the church after they leave the morning
 of June 24 to make sure everything is set for a group coming in in the afternoon.
- Thanks to KC for welcoming the cyclists.
- Kathy Dloniak has had to submit a letter of resignation to the Deacons. Family obligations are often keeping her in Buffalo.
- The budget was approved as presented.
- Thanks to David Tiffany and Sharon Mugle who have both manned Fellowship Hall when Rural Ministry was delivering for the Food Pantry.
- The Food Pantry received a \$3,000 check from Susan Guziec's company, Healthy Community.
- Reese and a rotation of volunteers continue to serve our youngest attendees.
- Thank you to Susan and Rey Spangler for installing grab rails to help folks climb the stairs to the chancel.
- Holly will be gone June 25th. She and Carol Calarco have discussed having a "lessons in carols" type of service in her absence.
- Holly has spent much time on Pastoral Care in the last month as well as connecting with our digital people and groups such as the Girl Scouts who regularly use out building.
- Holly has become the full time moderator for the meetings of the COM/United Presbyterian Church in Randolph, has participated in some local clergy gatherings, and officiated at Tim Heavern's funeral on May 26th.
- Fredonia Glass will be fixing the broken window in the sanctuary. Carpet cleaning in Fellowship hall is scheduled for June 20.
- Fire inspection was successfully completed on June 13 but the Johnson Controls fire alarm system needs to be upgraded.
- Rehabilitation of sanctuary porch is still being considered.
- Rev. Clark-Porter's vacation requests have been approved.
- Dates for the Feeding Fredonia Challenge were set: October 15-27.
- The Tiffany's will no longer be able to donate the first Saturday of the month to the Farmers' Market. We will need volunteers to help cover the market on those Saturdays.
- Because of supply chain issues and postage costs rising there will be an increase in Equal Exchange prices.

 to our services, donated a compost tumbler to the garden project.
- Trish Lehnen will do a presentation during a coffee hour. Topic: Roadside Plants.
